# Carrying the Message: Hospitals & Institutions (H+I)

Recently I had the pleasure of attending the HandI (pronounced "handy") SoCal Intergroup Conference in Ventura, Ca. Mind you, I have very little experience in H&I work... I have merely been a volunteer on the Bridging the Gap (BTG) committee for a few years in SLO County.

I found out about the conference through an email received in my NNL editor inbox at the Central Office. Kelly sent out some great information on the conference which included 4 stories from H&I A.A. members for us to run in our newsletters. *Always* desperate for a front-page story (hint, hint); I jumped on it and published one of them in our last issue. She had me at, "Dear Newsletter Editor" ...

I got to meet Kelly in person at the conference and she is a true DD - "Dedicated Dynamo"! She was much appreciated by the entire Intergroup and received lots of praise from the podium. She will be the Conference Chair in 2019 at the same beautiful venue; Marriott Four Points Ventura Marina. Well worth going to if you're interested in this type of commitment! So, without further ado, here is:

# **Kelly's Story**

I got sober in March 1986. The recovery home where I got sober did not have panels, so that is not how I learned about H+I. We went out into the community for open meetings. I got involved with H+I with no planning on my part. In meetings, people talked about going into "institutions," and I thought that sounded interesting.

My first panel was at Betty Ford. That was an eyeopener. The people looked so good! Way better than I did in my first 28 days. And they thought I was a long-timer, with my 92 days. It was great! I enjoyed the questions and the exchange with the residents there.

So, I signed up for more. One day, I got a call from someone who was a real old-timer. I was shocked he would call me. He asked me if I was willing to go into prisons, and I said "I guess so. As long as I can get out again." So, we went into CRC in Norco. I had

my ID, but had no clearance. I do not know how this happened, but I was on a panel list and allowed to go in...and then come back out! (I later got a regular clearance and went in all the time.)

Inside there were about 250 men in a big room. It was scary for me to talk in front of that many people. But I took off my high heels, my legs stopped shaking, and everything was fine.

I truly fell in love with prison work. I went on that panel for the next 6 or 7 years, and it will always have a special place in my heart. We went as often as possible, driving from Indio to Norco on a Tuesday night. Panels in prisons were different than they are today. In those days, we got to take coffee and books to the guys. I even took in Valentines and Christmas cards a few times!

It was an LA panel, but the man who took me in with him that first time would take me to panels wherever he could get clearance for us. He was then, and will always will be, my hero in AA. He and another man (wearing an eye patch) changed my AA story.

I have moved around a lot since those early days; and get to go into a lot of different prisons and jails. I have even worked in quite a few of them, since I went into the treatment field and work as a clinical social worker.

H+I is my biggest reward for doing the work of staying sober. I love what happens when I get the privilege of carrying the message in to those who are just like me. I have a lot of criminal behavior in my drinking story. And I know there is nothing different about me and these men and women, except I was given the gift of sobriety, which I hope I remember to always be grateful for and to open anew every day.

I currently get to go into 2 State prisons, a State Mental Hospital, 1 Federal prison, and 2 County jails; along with being the Intergroup Rep for Ventura County H+I. I was the Co-Director for the H+I Intergroup Conference 2018 in Ventura, CA. I hope I got to meet you and hear about your experience in H+I; or to help you get started on creating that story. It's true; it *is* better to give than to receive.

# Step 6


Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
