Leaving the Results to God

My name is Mary and I'm an alcoholic and the mother of two sons. My sons were raised in a sick, alcoholic home. I am the mother whose drinking progressed into rage and madness. I am the mother who verbally abused and physically beat my little boys. I could not stop myself from my own actions. I knew I was wrong, and I could not stop. King Alcohol owned me body and soul.

I ran away from my home on the East Coast when my sons were in their late teens. I tried to start over, but I brought my bottle with me. Finally, after a few attempts, I began my sobriety in September 1979.

After a couple of months, I asked a lady to be my sponsor. She had dignity in her life. I wanted that for myself. She got me going on the Steps right away. I was so ashamed of my life and of what I had become. When I said to her, "What shall I do?" her answer was, "Do the Steps. Start with Step One." She and I went to Step meetings together and read the Steps together at her kitchen table. We talked, wrote, and laughed. Thank God for her humor. She gave me hope, and I was willing to learn.

Eventually I got to Step Nine. I was so afraid I'd do it wrong, but God prepared the way for me. My firstborn was now in his early twenties and was visiting from his home on the East Coast. We were alone together in a peaceful, beautiful place, and I began saying my amends. He let me talk and was completely accepting of my words. It was one of the most frightening and courageous times of my life and one of the most rewarding. Our relationship is healing and our love for each other is better and better as time goes on.

I wish this had been the case with my younger son. When I approached him in order to make my amends, he stopped me and said he didn't want to hear my "stuff." He said he didn't believe I was alcoholic and that I was using this as an excuse. God gave me the courage to sit still and listen to him. When he was finished, I was able to tell him that I loved him very much and that it didn't matter if he believed I was alcoholic. The fact that I believe I am is what's important. This took place in my first year of sobriety, and we have not had such a talk again (I've been sober for eighteen years). Our relationship has a long way to go today.

I have done a lot of Step work--inventories, Fifth Steps with my sponsors, praying, and releasing my son to God. Our program has given me the courage and dignity to go on with my life and see my value as a sober woman. I have shared my experience with many AA young men and women, some of whom have been very close to my son's age and who grew up with a drunken mom like me.

AA has taught me that our Higher Power is our source for all that is good for us and for others. As I trust this wonderful program, I leave the results to God and I go about doing what I am supposed to do: stay sober, go to meetings, live the Steps, and say yes to AA's principles and Traditions. I don't know if my younger son and I will heal our relationship. I have to continue to be willing to do my part. The rest is up to God's wisdom.

For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority – a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants; they do not govern.


A.A. Materials on YouTube
