Remembrance of Wolfgang

It's been a year (April 16th) since Wolfgang was killed in an off-road accident near Pozo, California. He was just 23 years old and a friend to many people in recovery, here on the Central Coast. I did not know him all that well; there was forty years difference in our ages. I remember some of what he shared in meetings and what was said at his memorial service. But I thought about him a lot this past year. The young man left an impression.

This is what I will always remember about Wolfgang (known to old friends and family as Wolfy): I never heard him curse or use foul language. I never even heard him raise his voice in anger or say anything negative about anyone. He was soft spoken and thoughtful. He loved music and I understand that he was an accomplished guitarist, though I never got to hear him play. His mom (who named him after Mozart) made mention that the two of them would sometimes sit and make up songs together. The example she gave at the memorial was called "Wally from Cal Poly" (which would make a great title for a musical.) Wolfgang had started a serious career, working in the field of Geology. He was active in AA, service sponsoring people and taking commitments. When I heard him share, it was always straight forward and seemed to come from the heart. Family members and friends said that when he was a child, he learned to love gardening and had a real respect for nature and the environment. He was curious about everything and loved to hike and

explore...not paying much attention to "No Trespassing" signs along the way. And he loved animals, especially his dog Lobo. Lobo was with him at the end (thankfully, not injured in the accident) and stayed with him for two days, until his body was found. I always choke up whenever I think about that.

I've been told in recovery that one must love God, even if one doesn't always like what happens. I am still sad and angry over the loss of our friend. Wolfgang is gone from us way too soon. We needed him here. But all who knew him will continue to remember him fondly and we will miss him. Be at peace, Wolfy.

Are you an alcoholic?

The list of questions which follows have helped a lot of people find out if they had a problem with alcohol. But please keep in mind that you are the only one who can say if you have a problem or not. Even if you have been told by others that you do, the important thing is that you can decide for yourself.

- 1. Do you lose time from work or school due to drinking?
- 2. Does drinking make your life at home unhappy?
- 3. Do you drink to lose shyness and build selfconfidence?
- 4. Is drinking affecting your Reputation?
- 5. Do you ever get into trouble with money because of your Drinking?
- 6. Does it bother you if somebody says you drink too much?
- 7. Have you ever lost friends because of drinking?
- 8. Do you blame your drinking on the behavior of others?
- 9. Has drinking decreased your ambition?
- 10. Do you ever want a drink "the morning after?"
- 11. Do you have a hard time sleeping because of your Drinking?
- 12. Has your ability to work or study decreased since you started drinking?
- 13. Does drinking get you into trouble in school, on the job or in business?
- 14. Do you drink to escape from problems or worries?
- 15. Do you drink alone?
- 16. Have you ever had a complete memory loss as a result of drinking?
- 17. Have you ever been treated by a doctor for your drinking?
- 18. Have you ever been arrested, locked up or hospitalized on account of drinking?
- 19. Have you ever felt guilty after drinking?
- 20. Do you think you have a drinking problem?

If you answered "yes" to three or more questions, you may be an alcoholic. But remember, we in A.A. follow this program voluntarily. No one forces us to admit we are alcoholics. No one forces us to stay sober in A.A. We do it because we like what A.A. has to offer.
